

OFFICER COURSE FOR PEACE SUPPORT OPERATIONS [OC/PSO]

This course is designed to enable an officer to carry out his duty as

- ▶ Commander or deputy commander of a company
- ▶ Platoon leader Staff Officer in a national [multinational] battalion [contingent]
- ▶ Junior Staff Officer in an international HQ

in the framework of Peace Support Operations.

CONTENTS:

After completing the course the participants are expected to be able to perform their respective duties in the framework of Peace Support Operations. The curriculum includes:

- ▶ Tasks of a platoon leader and a company commander
- ▶ Staff duties in a national [multinational] battalion [contingent]
- ▶ Information about United Nations Organisation
- ▶ Information about NATO, OSCE and EU
- ▶ Information about civilian organisations involved in PSO
- ▶ Preparation for missions
- ▶ Psychological stress during and after deployment
- ▶ Medical training, hygiene and food preparation
- ▶ Communications
- ▶ Legal aspects of PSO
- ▶ Background of PSO
- ▶ PSO techniques such as OP duties, CP duties, patrolling, inspection
- ▶ Negotiation and liaison both in theory and in practice
- ▶ Multinational staff duties in PSO NATO- and UN-based CPX at battalion, company and platoon level
